Dear Mr. Preston,

Pursuant to the state open records law, Ky. Rev. Stat. Ann. Secs. 61.870 to 61.884 and 61.991, I write to request that the Kentucky Office of Homeland Security produce for my inspection all records prepared, owned, used or maintained by you or other personnel within the Kentucky Office of Homeland Security as related to KRS 39G.010(2)(a):

- Any and all information related to the publication of the findings of the General Assembly that stress the dependence on Almighty God as being vital to the security of the Commonwealth of Kentucky.

- Any and all information and documents related to the inclusion of the provisions of KRS 39A.285(3) in training and educational materials.

- Any and all information related to the display of the permanent plaque at the entrance to the state's Emergency Operations Center stating the text of KRS 39A.285(3). This would include any and all costs of the plaque and its installation.

If your agency does not maintain these public records, please let me know who does and include the proper custodian's name and address.

I agree to pay any reasonable copying and postage fees of not more than \$100.00. If the cost would be greater than this amount, please notify me. Please provide a receipt indicating the charges for each document.

As provided by the open records law, I will expect your response within three (3) business days.

If you choose to deny this request, please provide a written explanation for the denial including a reference to the specific statutory exemption(s) upon which you rely. Also, please provide all segregable portions of otherwise exempt material.

Please be advised that I am prepared to pursue whatever legal remedy necessary to obtain access to the requested records. I would note that willful violation of the open records law can result in a fine of up to \$25 for each day that I am denied access and the award of attorney fees and costs.
